The Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts was established in 1983 and today consists of five departments: visual art, creative arts, Thai music, Western music and dance. The faculty prides itself on the production of internationally acclaimed graduates and the significant contributions it has made to the art and cultural industry in Thailand and beyond. The faculty members include prominent National Artists as well as avant-garde designers, artists, practice-led researchers and theorists in the fields of modern art, Thai art, graphic design, fashion history, Western music theory, Western music composition, ballet theory, Thai traditional music, Thai contemporary dance, Thai dance choreography, likay folk theatre, Thai royal court music and music therapy.

Why study expressive arts therapy at Chulalongkorn University?

Expressive arts therapy is a dynamic field in the mental health profession. It is based on the empirical knowedge that the process of artistic creation, under the guidance of a qualified therapist, enables individuals to become more expressive and communicative, develop self-awareness and therefore begin to heal. The practice can be applied to people of all ages. It is especially valuable with clients who have difficulties expressing themselves verbally and is useful in addressing trauma because of art's capacity to express traumatic imagery and experience.

The Master of Arts in Expressive Arts Therapy integrates various media of expression-visual arts, drama, storytelling, dance and movement and so on-to offer therapists a variety of modalities they can apply in their practice that suit the needs of different clients. In this two-year programme, students will acquire knowledge on methods and techniques of expressive arts therapy, research methods, assessment, and ethics in clinical practice, as well as field training under supervision. This is to enable students to develop new and appropriate interventions for varied populations in different settings.



COURSE STRUCTURE

The M.A. in Expressive Arts Therapy is a two-year (four semesters) full-time programme for graduates who intend to pursue the discipline of expressive arts therapy. The programme encompasses a wide spectrum of courses, including core, specialised, advanced courses, clinical practicum, and individual and group supervision. Programme offers two options in the study programme: "Plan A: Thesis Option" and "Plan B: Non-Thesis Option"

*Date may vary depending on the announcement of the University's academic calendar.



REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's degree in all fields of study with minimum of 2.50 GPA
- If students have not graduated in art fields or psychology, they
 must have at least 1 year of any practical experience.
- English proficiency (attained within the previous 2 years):
 CU-TEP score of at least 60 or TOEFL score of at least 500 or IELTS (Academic) score of at least 5.0
- Other qualifications are subject to the announcements from the programme committee.

- A copy of relevant official transcript(s)
- A copy of an English Proficiency Test official report
- A completed application form (photograph included)
- Two letters of recommendation
- Statement of Purpose (SOP)
- Resume


