- Bachelor's degree in MUSIC, PSYCHOLOGY, HEALTH SCIENCE, or other related fields with at least a 3.0 GPA
- High level of music performance proficiency, especially in piano, guitar and singing
- English Proficiency Test certificate (attained within the previous 2 years): TOEFL paperbased score of at least 500 or IELTS (academic) score of at least 5.0 or CU-TEP score of at least 60

 - **c.** Free improvisation on a melodic or harmonic instrument (3-5 minutes)
 - **d.** A short piece on your main instrument (5 minutes)
